<u>Website</u> – Chairs – Peter Elliott and Meredith Parente – This committee has overlapped from our billboard and networking teams. Keep an eye out for big changes – specifically offering help and facts about abortion to abortion-minded women.

To paraphrase Charles Dickens, it's the best of times, and it's the worst of times. With the overturning of Roe v. Wade, abortion is now up to the states. In some states, abortion has been virtually eliminated, while in others, it's expanding to incredible numbers. LEGISLATION UPDATE ... FROM ANITA



PA SUPREME COURT USING "ERA" TO PROTECT ABORTION RIGHTS:

HISTORY: Congress first proposed the ERA in 1923. In March of 1972 it read: "Equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States of by any State on account of sex."

CURRENT: Allegheny Reproductive Health Center vs. Pennsylvania Dept. of Human

<u>Services</u>: This case is trying to put abortion as a right in the PA Constitution and use Medicaid funding to cover. This is an ongoing case with appeals.

In this case, abortion clinics are challenging a state law which has historically prohibited public funds being used for abortion. Abortion activists are again pushing for ratification of the ERA.

The "Allegheny Reproductive Health Center", (*listed in the name of the case*), includes Planned Parenthood and Affiliates through the state.

As of January 2024:

The Court ruled Pennsylvania's abortion providers could challenge the Pennsylvania ban on Medicaid coverage for abortion as sex discrimination under the Equal Rights Amendment and as a violation of the Equal Protection provisions of the Pennsylvania Constitution. In doing so, the court overruled the decades-old precedent that foreclosed such a challenge.

PLEASE PRAY. A law prohibiting abortion does not treat men and women differently or, put in the Pennsylvania ERA's terms, discriminate against women. Abortion activists are again pushing for ratification of the ERA.

I will be meeting with the State Reps and Senators this month and will have an update on this. More to come.

NEW PA HOUSE BILL HB 2034 SEEKS TO REPEAL PRO-LIFE PROTECTION

This a bad bill. Primary Sponsor is Rep. Kristine Howard. Co Sponsors in our SW PA area are Reps.Venkat, Kinkead, and Mayes. Reps Daley, Shusterman, Kenyatta and Rozzi are cosponsors as well as many others. Since we pay PA Taxes, feel free to contact them by phone or letters saying this bill is NOT what the PA People want.

GOOD NEWS! PA State Senator Katie Muth plans to introduce Emersyn's Law.

Emersyn's Law would allow for the charges of homicide by vehicle, aggravated assault by vehicle, homicide by vehicle while driving under the influence, and aggravated assault by vehicle while driving under the influence to be applied for the death of an unborn child. The bill would also include an exemption stating the mother of an unborn child could not be charged under this law. Even though Sen. Muth is not one of ours, this is significant piece of legislation that could set precedents. Since we do pay PA State Taxes, we do a right to thank her and encourage her:
